HELP! The fencing around the Triangle has been in place for many years, and now needs to have some extensive repairs. A Triangle Help Out Day was held on 8 July when we had hoped to replace a significant number of rotting posts and rails. However, we discovered that doing this by hand was not possible and machinery is required.

Farewell To "Mac" MacLatchy

We are sad to announce the recent death of one of Langford Budvilles true characters, Gareth MacLatchy or Mac as he was known by all who knew him.

Born in 1945 in Chatham, Kent, Mac was a grammar school boy who left school at 16 to join 29 Commando of the Royal Marines. He went on to see active service in Borneo in the mid 1960's before leaving the army in 1969 to marry Julie his first wife, who he had met in Plymouth whilst on leave.

Mac worked in a number of roles during his career including selling insurance, and as a Civil Servant at the Taunton Tax Office. However, it was his love of music and literature for which most people will remember him. A renowned guitarist, Mac played in a number of club bands specialising in acoustic jazz guitar throughout the 70's, and his home is full of his beloved books.

A familiar figure around the village, Mac could often be seen walking his husky, Olga, in one of his eccentric hats or in front of the bar at the Martlet where he was a

Hambe Kahle Saranne Cessford

Age 11, Saranne was taken to visit an old colonial house encompassed by a veranda, under which were lined up rows of rocks. Fascinated, she decided then and there to be a geologist and pursued her goal through a peripatetic upbringing in SA (due to her father's air force postings) and an even more peripatetic life after marrying Tony, a Geordie geologist then working for De Beers, whom she met whilst studying at Witwatersrand University.

Their first home for three years was a 15' caravan on the Karoo. Cape Town followed before London when Tony found employment in the oil industry. When the company moved them to the USA, she continued her studies during seven years in Houston, pursuing a Masters at Rice before their final return to London in 1981, when she enrolled at Imperial College for a PhD in rock deformation studies. A company flat near Sloane Square was a far cry from the caravan on the Karoo! Summers were spent around Glenelg, above the Sound of Sleat in Scotland. She combined studies and part-time jobs in geology with family life; daughter Fiona and son Duncan, (who was tragically killed during his gap year in SA). The children boarded when they were posted to Indonesia for three years and then Tony retired.

But they did not cease to be rolling stones! A house in Newbury was exchanged for Anstey Farm near Dulverton where sheep and poultry kept them busy, though Saranne was also working for Rio Tinto as a "gofor", ie a researcher. She certainly, all her working life, has had to keep up with IT from which we have benefited enormously. Seven years later they sold the farm to return to Cape Town, where sadly Tony died suddenly in 2010. Saranne then started volunteering at Kirstenbosch Gardens which rekindled her interest in botany, inherited from her maternal







grandmother - Saranne's roots lie in the family farm in the Free Orange State. All things spring from the earth beneath our feet and her passion for geology has made her a perpetual student, ever curious to learn and delighting to teach, her retentive memory enabling her to consolidate and apply her knowledge with the meticulous standards which we have seen in Roundabout.

Now after ten years in Langford Budville where she has shown an exceptional talent for fitting into the community and has contributed in many ways, Saranne tackles the next stage in her life — a flat in Penarth near Fiona and her husband André. But the travels are not over and as she loves non-tropical islands, she would choose to return to Australia and visit Lord Howe Island.

We thank her for all she has achieved here and wish her well! In particular, we will miss her artistic eye as revealed by all the photos in Round About.

CHOCOLATE CHIP BROWNIES

Not so seasonal, but definitely a rather delicious, if somewhat calorific, treat. A favourite from the kitchen of Sally Pritchard.

Ingredients

240g salted butter

270g dark chocolate
160g milk chocolate
220g golden castor sugar
220g soft light brown
sugar
1 tsp vanilla essence
160g plain flour (the less
unhealthy bit!)
250g chocolate chips
4 eggs





Method

Pre heat oven to 140 degrees for a fan oven.

Line a baking tray with greaseproof paper (I use a 14" x 10" tray).

Warm butter, chocolate and castor sugar in a bowl over a pan of simmering water until melted.

Stir and leave to cool.

In a separate bowl whisk the brown sugar, eggs and vanilla essence.

Stir in the flour and chocolate chips.

Add the cooled butter and chocolate mixture and pour into the baking tray.

Lick spoon!

Bake for 35 to 40 minutes.


Allow to cool in the tin, chill in fridge before cutting.

Keep pushing for a Greener LB

The Greener Langford Budville project is still alive but it needs even more community action. A greener government might give financial assistance to increase the number of solar panels in the village. There are those who say: Why can't they leave us alone? But this ignores the many warnings. Our walk was a small gesture for nature's future and the need for wildlife corridors. The route we took could be one of those - but until farming practices and government attitudes change there will be little progress on general habitat improvement. We must not let them forget - No Nature, No Future.

Scything Jamboree

If you care about nature, please join the Conservation Group to keep our footpaths open, to help on the Common and the Triangle and to maintain the Jubilee Wood (most trees flourishing in spite of the weather). On the first **Sunday and Monday of September**, we are planning a **Scything Jamboree**, scything and raking the grass on the Wildflower Area. Everyone could contribute, if only by bringing cakes and ale.

Green fingers FEEDING SUMMER VEGETABLES

As the tomato, cucumber and aubergine season gets into full swing, the questions of when to start feeding, how much to feed and with what pop up again!

Most of these plants are container grown and thus rely on us to maintain their nutrient levels, because however good your compost and mulching have been it won't be sufficient for the season. There are a number of home made options around such as comfrey or nettle tea and the extract from wormeries . All of which provide some nutritional value but as the strength required and nutritional content are unmeasured and variable, turning to a proprietary product is usually a more reliable answer.

Which sent me to the garden centre for research...... very interesting! For a start be very wary of the use of organic, as a lot of the products are organic chemically, but carry no certification for their manufacture or content. So if you want an organically produced product, look for a logo such as Organic Farmers and Growers or The Soil Association.

The next thing of interest was to look on the label for the nutritional values of the product, several said nothing at all particularly the seaweed ones, so again you have no idea what you are gaining in terms of Nitrogen, Potassium and phosphorus NPK.

Green fingers FEEDING SUMMER VEGETABLES (cont)

Also different brands have different strengths of NPK and thus have different dilution rates, making them some of them much better value than others. The own brand working out to be significantly better value.

As to feeding, it really is a case of following the label on the back as each product is always a bit different. But always mix the food into the watering can well, avoid getting water on the foliage of tomato plants and never make it a bit stronger for luck!





Aubergines and cucumbers are very thirsty plants, but tomatoes can be more flavoursome if not over watered. The most important thing with tomatoes in particular to avoid split fruit or blossom end rot is to give them the same amount each day, a nurseryman told me to have a tank and a jug or container and use that always. We chose to feed on a set day of the week and call it feeding Friday to help us remember.

JUBILEE WOOD

In 2020, the Greener Langford Budville group won a grant of £11,300 from the Somerset County Council Climate Emergency Community Fund.

This led to surveys on Biodiversity, Low Energy Travel and Household Energy, But it also stimulated interest in the parish in creating opportunities and spaces for wildlife, wildflowers and carbon capture.

The Hendy family were quick to offer land for a wood to commemorate the Platinum Jubilee of 2022 and grants from The Woodland Trust, Asda. The National Lottery and The Somerset Fund made planting possible.

In January 2023, 800 trees and shrubs were planted, with every child in the local school contributing to the perimeter hedge.


As an experiment, 75 of the tree guards and all the hedge guards are fully biodegradable.

The site is ideal, sectuded, left fallow for years, abutting the nature reserve of Langford Heathfield and with pedestrian access for the public. An agreement with The Woodland Trust protects the wood well into the future and work by our local Conservation Group should give regular maintenance.

The planting scheme, illustrated by Lindsay Birch at Eightonefive Design shows only the approximate siting of trees but oak and hombeam form the central core of a wood which will lock up carbon for many years, while providing a home for nature and pleasure for generations yet to come.
